Jones County Economic Development Business Lab Open for Business!

Jones County Economic Development (JCED) is a public-private partnership dedicated to strengthening the economic base in Jones County by assisting existing businesses, attracting new investments and jobs, and fostering a business climate favorable for economic growth. With this type of mission, it's crucial that JCED offers a wide-range of tools for all of our businesses, including new businesses looking to open in our communities. This is where the idea for the Jones County Business Lab was born!

The first iteration of this idea was in the partnership and development of the Monticello Innovation Lab, a place where businesses could go to meet clients, rent some space to get out of the house if needed, and interact with other great entrepreneurs. It also allowed for some direct business coaching and a chance for entrepreneurs to do a small scale test of their businesses after launching. The Innovation Lab had quality internet access, videoconferencing capabilities, private space, and more that would be ideal for early stage entrepreneurs that were not ready to make the commitment yet to a larger space for the business.

"However, we realized that there was a component

missing from this paradigm," states Derek Lumsden, Executive Director of JCED. "Where were the opportunities for existing businesses to get some coaching opportunities? How could those businesses still in the beginning phases access resources to help them decide what they should do next and how they should move forward? While there are some answers with the Small Business Development Center, our office, etc.., this did not address all of the needs of local businesses, including the ability to have consistent online coaching and mentoring."

The second iteration of the idea for the Jones County Business Lab was a partnership between Jones County Economic Development and the Rural Ideas Network, a national non-profit organization that partners with rural communities and economic development organizations to provide a robust set of services to entrepreneurs. With a grant from the Economic Development Administration, the Rural Ideas Network was able to build out a website for Jones County that allows access to all services. The Business Lab provides a variety of high-quality business support services that entrepreneurs (including both new and established businesses) can access at no cost!

All Business Lab services are delivered remotely via videoconferencing, making it easy to use these resources to grow a business. It also allows local businesses to access the Business Lab 24/7 and take advantage of these services from anywhere. Services include:

• 1:1 Startup Coaching

This service is for entrepreneurs with a business idea and are ready to take the next steps to get it started with experienced entrepreneurs serving as startup coaches.

Business Management Coaching

This service helps new and established ventures overcome common growth obstacles, develop effective strategies, identify new income opportunities, and stay focused on success.

Succession Plan Coaching

This service helps guide an entrepreneur who is ready to transition a business or just to plan ahead. Businesses answer key questions and gather information that potential buyers will need to understand the value of the business.

Website Evaluations

This service offers a fresh set of eyes to review an entrepreneur's website to provide constructive feedback and offer tools to help them accomplish any necessary changes.

Website Design Bootcamps

This service offers great resources for entrepreneurs who need a website but don't want to pay thousands of dollars for someone to develop it. These camps teach entrepreneurs how to use WIX to build and manage a website that truly represents their brand.

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Peer Learning Roundtables

This service allows entrepreneurs to connect with rural business owners from across the country to talk shop with these online video discussions. Each roundtable is facilitated and focuses on important topics to business owners.

Peer Learning Forum

This virtual platform allows entrepreneurs to exchange ideas and get advice from other entrepreneurs from across the country. The forum helps new and experienced business owners connect with each other, share valuable advice and perspectives, learn from each other, and move their business forward.

P.E.O Educational Loan Fund Opportunity!

Established in 1973, the PEO Program for Continuing Education is a need-based grant program providing one-time financial assistance to women whose education has been interrupted and who find it necessary to return to school to complete a degree or certification that will improve their marketable skills for employment to support themselves and/or their families. The PEO Educational Loan Fund allows women a chance to get a low interest rate on their educational funding needs.

The Educational Loan Fund has a maximum loan amount of \$12,000 for non-degree accredited programs, an associate or bachelor degree; \$15,000 for a Master's, and \$20,000 for a doctoral degree. The current interest rate is 2% and there are no loan origination fees. Online programs and internships/study abroad programs in the US or Canada may be eligible.

Women must have a high school diploma or equivalent; have two qualified co-signers for the loan; meets the minimum credit score of 625; and submits the application within six to 24 months prior to stated graduation or course completion date.

Applicants can only submit for the loan online and must have an online chapter recommendation form submitted. Applicants must agree to all loan terms and applications are processed year-round. The local PEO Chapter must approve of the applicant and send the chapter recommendation.

This is a great opportunity for women to go back to school and help get some of their costs covered at better financing than what would be possible through other student loan providers.
